

UCD Estate Services Privacy Notice - CSCB Secure Bike lock up

Introduction

This privacy notice explains how and why your personal data is used as part of the UCD Estate Services CSCB Secure Bike Lock up

The CSCB bike rack is a secure facility for the storage of a limited number of bicycles, whilst the bicycle owner is present on campus grounds. The CSCB bike rack is a metal fenced enclosed area that is accessible via a single access control door, secured with a magnetic lock. Two static CCTV cameras are erected in the enclosed area, providing CCTV coverage of all 62 bicycle racks within. The capacity of the CSCB bike rack is 124 bicycles. This allows for 2 bicycles to be secured to each Sheffield bicycle rack at any one time. Only those bicycle owners who are permitted to use the CSCB bike rack will be allowed to access the area. Estate Services staff will also have permission to access the area for security and maintenance purposes.

Please note that only active UCD students and staff that hold a current Ucard may be granted access to the CSCB bike rack.

Who are we?

Any personal information which you volunteer to the University will be treated in accordance with Irish and European Data Protection legislation.

Why and how do we collect and process the information and for how long we keep it?

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Why and how do we collect and process the information and for how long do we keep it?

We collect your personal data for the purpose of utilising an access control system by UCD Estate Services on the basis of consent.

We will collect the following types of personal data:

- Name.
- Staff/Student/Visitor number.
- Access control logs of activity on access control doors.

All personal data collected is retained until October 31st of the year if it is not renewed by the user or can be deleted before this date at the request of the user.

Your data is securely stored on an access control server and is password protected. We fully respect your right to privacy and treat all personal information with the appropriate standards of security and confidentiality, strictly in accordance with the GDPR.

Who has access to the information and who we share it with?

The personal data collected from you will be accessed by Estate Services, or other UCD units where required in the fulfilment of their function.

We will share the data collected with or supplied to An Garda Siochána (or other law enforcement body) when required.

What are your rights?

- The right to access You have the right to request access to your information/personal data.
- The right to rectification You have the right to request that we correct any information you believe is inaccurate or complete information you believe is incomplete.
- The right to withdraw consent You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.
- The right to erasure You have the right to request that we erase your personal information/data.
- The right to restrict processing You have the right to request that we restrict the processing of your personal data.
- The right to object to processing You have the right to object to processing of your personal data.
- The right to data portability You have the right to request that we transfer the data that we collected to another
 organisation, or directly to you.

If you wish to exercise any of your rights listed above, you can do so by contacting the UCD Estates Services using the contact information listed at the start of this Privacy Notice.
